**UNIT—I**

1. Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow :

The pursuit of a hobby offers enjoyment, education, companionship with others of similar interests, releasing diversion, and very often moderate monetary gain. Stamp-collecting, a mania in the 1840s, has grown into one of the world's most popular hobbies, a science and a business activity today.

Stamp collecting began immediately after the world saw the first postage stamp in 1840 issued by Great Britain. An educator named Rowland Hill of England is considered the father of philately. In 1837, he advocated prepayment of postage (under the old system the addressee paid the postage) and uniform domestic rates by weight (previously distance was a factor too). He devised a prepaid envelope (the Mulready envelope) and the adhesive postage stamp. The stamp picturing Queen Victoria was issued on May 1, 1840 and was in use from May 6. Two years later stamps were used by a private postal service in New York. Brazil and two Swiss cantons (Zurich and Geneva) were the next to issue stamps. The US used its first stamps on July 1, 1847 : one (5c) had Benjamin Franklin on it and the other (10c) had George Washington.

The bits of coloured paper were a curiosity and used specimens were retained by some people. When several countries began to issue stamps the idea of exchanging stamps came into existence and collecting became more interesting. Thus the hobby was born.

Who on earth is free from disease. Theoretically none. But practically all

can be. That is what the science of medicine is all about. The world is endowed with many systems of medicine : Allopathy, Homeopathy, Ayurveda, the Arabic, the Egyptian, the Graeco-Roman etc. While the Western system has entrenched itself with multiferous growth, there is a growing awareness of the distinctive efficacy of Eastern systems like Ayurveda.

All ancient civilizations—Egyptian, Babylonian, Indian and Chinese—developed their own systems of medicine. Egypt seems to have been the first and the best in the field. It had a fully developed medical system by the third millennium BC.

We know very little of the Babylonian system and much less, almost nothing, of the Indus Valley system. The Indian system as we know it, starts with the Rigveda (2000 BC). The earliest known medical treatise in China appeared around 450 BC.

The Egyptian system, like all other ancient systems, laboured under a

heavy load of superstition and magic. Yet it developed many cures that have stood the test of time. Pain killing drugs and sedatives were well-known to Egyptians. Onion as a cure for scurvy and also as a cure for intestinal disorders is an old Egyptian prescription.

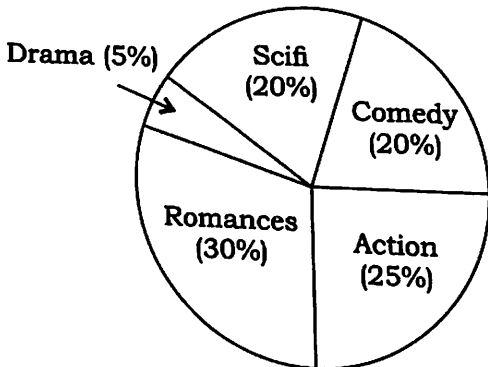
